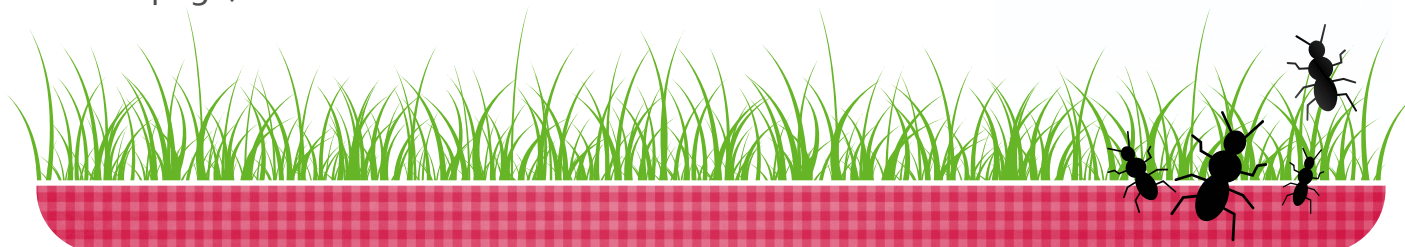

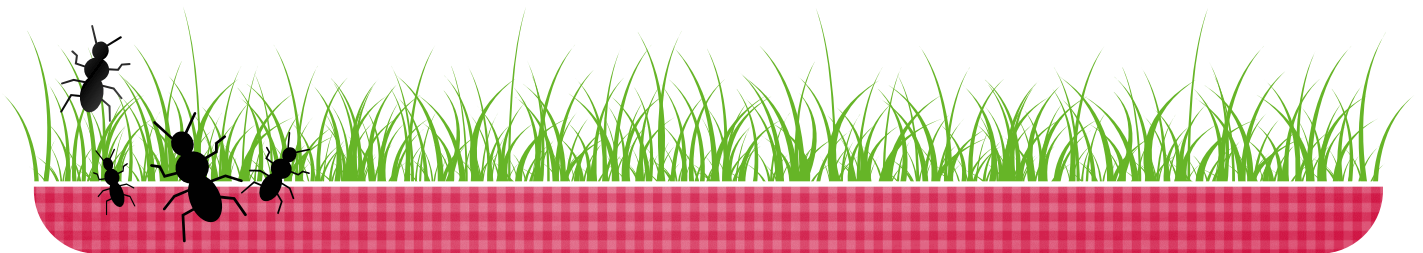

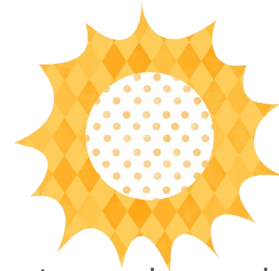

CAP cont'd

CAP is a partnership between the CSU Ag Extension office and Goodwill Industries Denver. Statistics reflect that within the state there are 36,180 farms and 59,479 agriculture operators. In each year 3,747 farmers/ranchers and 7,288 individuals living on rural farms will sustain an injury that limits their ability to continue in production at their prior level. At any one time, 11,105 people living on Colorado farms

have a limitation that could benefit from AgrAbility.



Our vision is to enhance the quality of life for these farmers and ranchers.

Remain independent in your agricultural life style!

When one hears the term limitation, they often think of the worst, an amputation or spinal cord injury. Yet that is not the only case. AgrAbility does serve those with the most serious of injuries however most of our clients have arthritis, back injury, or other limitation caused by years of hard work. Our grant from the USDA does not provide funds for the direct purchase of adaptive equipment, our four core services of education, direct service, marketing, and networking help to eliminate or reduce obstacles to success.

We accomplish this by coming to the farm or ranch and making an extensive

assessment of the farm or ranch operation. We conduct in-depth interviews of all participants on the farm to include family and employees. We observe the mobility, accessibility, and work tolerance issues on the farm and write recommendations for assistive technology and offer resources to acquire it.

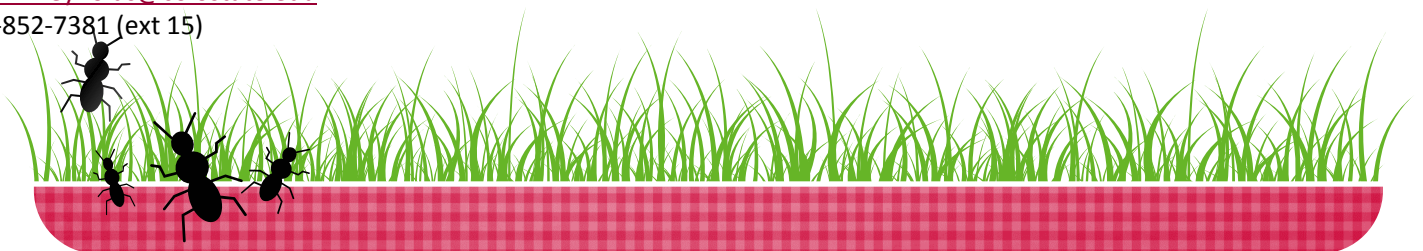
